Fridays: 10 am to midnight

Saturday: 9 am to midnight, Sunday: 9 am to 11:30 pm

The “Käfer Wiesn-Schänke” and the “Weinzelt”
are open until 1 am. Admission to the
fairgrounds is of course free.

Oide Wiesn (Old Oktoberfest):

Sunday to Thursday: 10 am to 11:30 pm

Friday and Saturday: 10 am to midnight

Admission 4 euros (admission free from
9 pm onwards).

Children under the age of 14 years are
free. Re-entry possible on the same
day; discounted prices for rides.

Please use public transportation:

There is nowhere to park near the fairgrounds!

Exception: Accessible parking (see map).

Use the U-Bahn (subway), S-Bahn (suburban train), bus or tram instead. It takes approximately 15 minutes to walk from the main train station to the fairgrounds.

“Ozapft is!” – This is what the Lord Mayor shouts when he taps the first keg of beer and declares the 191st Oktoberfest open on Saturday, 19 September, at 12 noon.

How to Wiesn

The right time: It’s best to come during the week – there’s more space and it’s cozier.

The right place: Tent closed? Don’t wait in line! Visit a different tent or explore the rides and carnival attractions.

The right way in: Use any entrance, avoid bottlenecks.

Tips for your visit

Bags and backpacks brought to Oktoberfest may have a maximum volume of three liters and may be no larger than 20 x 15 x 10 centimeters. Larger bags are not permitted.

Luggage storage facilities are located at the entrances P2, P5, P8 and P10.

Prams and strollers: No prams or strollers are allowed on Saturdays. On the other days, this ban on prams and strollers applies from 6 pm onwards.

Changing tables are available at the service center, at the “Familien-Platzl” (Straße 3, see map) and at some of the children’s carousels.

Bicycles, scooters, skateboards and the like are not permitted on the fairgrounds.

No animals are allowed on the fairgrounds at any time, with the exception of assistance dogs and animals belonging to the vendors and ride operators.
