Old Town Tour

From medieval market to modern metropolis

People visiting Munich for the first time or who do not have a lot of time should not miss a tour of the old town. The historic and beautiful part of Munich's city centre has a lot of stories and historical facts in store.

Of course, Munich's landmarks such as the Neues Rathaus (New Town Hall), Marienplatz (main square) and the Frauenkirche (Church of Our Lady) cannot be missed during a tour of the old town. Your tour guide also has exciting stories to tell about the famous Hofbräuhaus (Beer Hall). Highlights such as Maximilianstrasse, the Residence and the Feldherrnhalle (Field Marshalls' Hall) at Odeonsplatz (Odeons Square) are also visited during the tour.

New Town Hall Tour

A peek behind the scenes of the neo-Gothic treasure trove

The famous Neues Rathaus (New Town Hall) offers much more than just its Glockenspiel (carillon), which chimes daily at 11 am and 12 am (in summer also at 5 pm). An entertaining tour leads through its prestigious rooms, e.g. the large and small meeting rooms, the Rathaus balcony, stage for FC Bayern championship celebrations and the reading room of the Law Library. The history of the building and the numerous figures from the town's rich past that adorn the Rathaus façade are also part of the tour. On selected days, a visit to the Altes Rathaus (Old Town Hall) is also included.

Please note: As the venue might be booked for events, it is not guaranteed that all tours can take place or that all rooms can be visited.

Visit to the Law Library

It's a kind of magic!

The Law Library in the Neues Rathaus (New Town Hall) – probably the city's most beautiful library – impresses with its tall shelves full of books, the wrought-iron spiral staircases and the Art Nouveau gallery. Established in 1843, the reading room is still used today by law enthusiasts as a quiet retreat for reading and studying. Occasionally, lectures, discussion and readings are also held here.

With its magical ambience, this library could be mistaken for a setting from the "Harry Potter" films – in fact, it has served as the backdrop for other stories. Your guide will know which which stories these are.

New Town Hall at the Marienplatz

Visit to the New Town Hall Tower

Sightseeing platform with panoramic views: Towers, Old Town, Alps

From the tower of the Neues Rathaus (New Town Hall), visitors have a sweeping view of all of Munich's major attractions, and on clear days also of the Bavarian Alps. Thanks to the elevator, the tower is easy to access. Within a few moments, the lift takes visitors up to a height of 85 metres, from where they can admire a different city highlight in every direction: Directly opposite is the Alter Peter (St. Peter's Church), the Frauenkirche (Church of Our Lady) stands to one side of the tower, the Altes Rathaus (Old Town Hall) on the other side and to the north lies the Italian-style Theatinerkirche (Theatine Church). Weather permitting, you can see the impressive mountain range of the Alps dominating the southern horizon.

Justizpalast Tour

Jurisprudence: Past and present

Embark on a guided tour of the current headquarters of the Bavarian State Ministry of Justice and delve into the captivating history and significance of this neo-Baroque court and administration building.

Your guide will explain the unique architecture of the building and historical context during the era of the Prince Regent. Explore Room 253, which commemorates the Nazi show trials of the members of the White Rose resistance group, including the Scholl siblings.

And what does the Justizpalast (Palace of Justice) stand for today? Your guide will tell you which courts convene within these walls, which sensational trials took place here and which prominent figures sat in the dock.
