# 5 NS-Dokumentationszentrum

Brienner Straße 34 Tue-Sun 10 am – 7 pm

With the NS Documentation Center, opened in spring 2015, Munich has received a central place of learning and remembrance about the dark history of National Socialism. In addition to a permanent exhibition, the museum features a multimedia learning facility, special exhibitions as well as a diverse educational and event program.

The DenkStätte Weiße Rose is located in the atrium of the Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität Munich, close to the historical place where the resistance fighters Hans and Sophie Scholl were arrested on February 18, 1943.









# Residenzmuseum

Residenzstraße 1

April - mid-October: daily 9 am - 6 pm Mid-October - March: daily 10 am - 5 pm

The Residenz, one of the greatest palaces in Germany, served as residence and seat of government to the Wittelsbach rulers until 1918. The splendid historical rooms and the Treasure Chamber are as impressive as the art collections.

# 11 Bier- und Oktoberfestmuseum

The history of Munich breweries and beer production is displayed in Munich's oldest town house which dates back to 1340. The museum tour explains the development of the Munich Oktoberfest from the royal wedding in 1810 to the greatest folk festival in the world.





