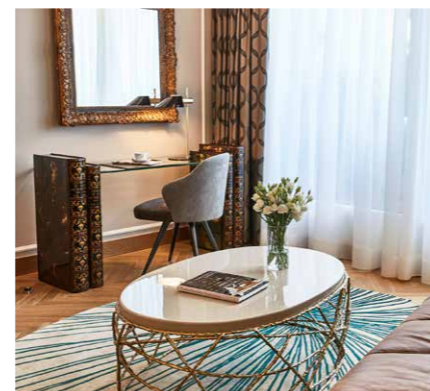

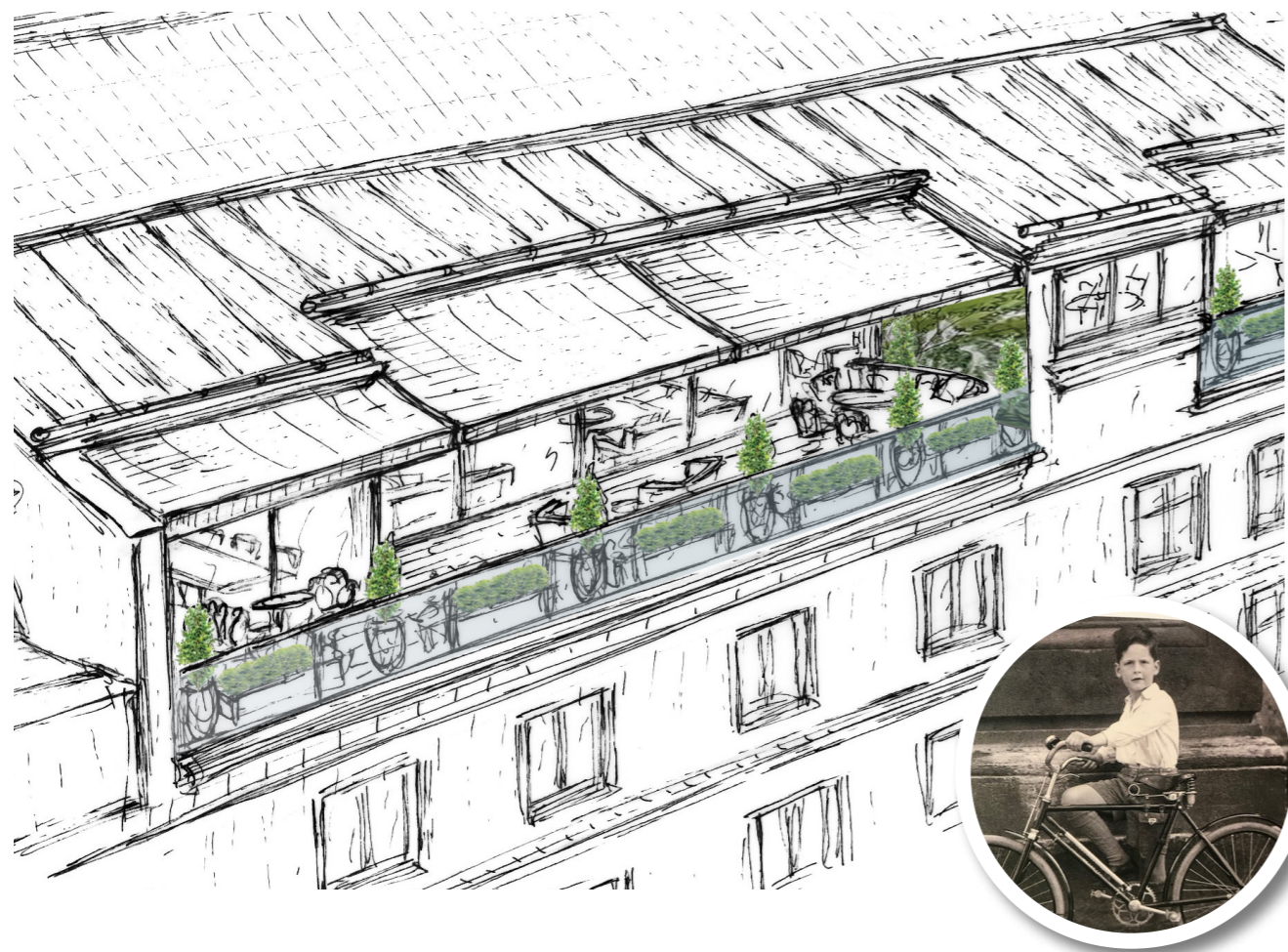
Hotel Vier Jahreszeiten Kempinski Munich Launches Royal Wing

From its inception, the Hotel Vier Jahreszeiten has had a strong royal connection. During the year of its 160th anniversary, and a decade after the introduction of Munich’s most spectacular suite – the Ludwig Suite – the Hotel Vier Jahreszeiten has secured the grand hotel’s prime position in the luxury market with the creation of a royal wing.

The central focus is the property’s third presidential suite – the Maximilian Suite – in which celebrated architect Colin Finnegan combined ultimate luxury with the finest of artisan craft.

The magical terrace of the Maximilian Suite is located on one of the highest points in Munich’s old town, where guests have a prime view over seven of city’s most magnificent buildings.

The Maximilian Suite is located on the top floor of the hotel, offering the best view of Munich’s seven most beautiful sights.

To the west, lies the “Old Peter” Church. Shifting the gaze, both the old and new Town Halls come into focus. The view takes in the Church of Our Lady, the National Theatre, the Theatinerkirche and, to the far right, the Bavarian State Chancellery.

For this “front row seat”, architect Colin Finnegan has created a space that is unforgettable. Individually manufactured masterpieces of old craftsmanship and modern pieces of furniture enhance the experience.

The focal point in the living room is a ceiling-high tapestry representing the four seasons. This impressive work was inspired by the lobby’s famous glass cupola with its seasonal blossoms.

It took 1,700 hours to complete this piece of art made from cotton, bast fibre, and pearls.

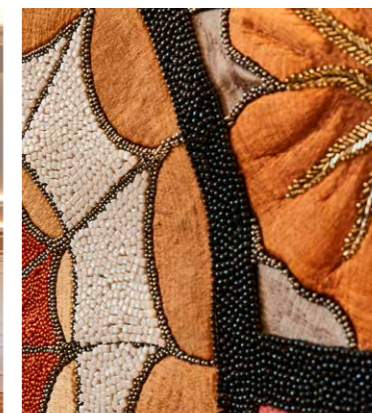
“No Better Seat in the House”

“On beautiful days, when the sky was clear and you could just make out the tips of the Alps in the south-east, nothing could surpass the grandeur and magnificence of the Bavarian capital.

And to witness the rare descent of an aeroplane or even a zeppelin – which never failed to fascinate us kids – one could not have a better seat in the house than on our terrace.”

This is how Otto Walterspiel remembered his childhood at the Vier Jahreszeiten in his book “An Open House. My Childhood at the Hotel Vier Jahreszeiten” (Bastei Lübbe, Cologne 2012).

The son of the hotel’s proprietor was born at the hotel in 1927. Together with his parents and siblings, Otto lived on the top floor of the building, exactly where the Maximilian Suite can be found today.





A Suite to Linger

An intimate space of true craftsmanship:
Finnegan's objective is realized in the suite's beautiful master bedroom.
Pillars made from walnut frame the octagonal room.

The ceiling is the focal element of the design concept.
It is detailed with stucco sun rays, and at the centre is a Murano glass lamp
with a 24-carat gold varnish. The architect was inspired by the golden
ceiling paintings at the Munich Residence, the home and seat
government of Bavarian electoral princes, dukes,
and kings from 1508 to 1918.



A Suite of Craftsmanship

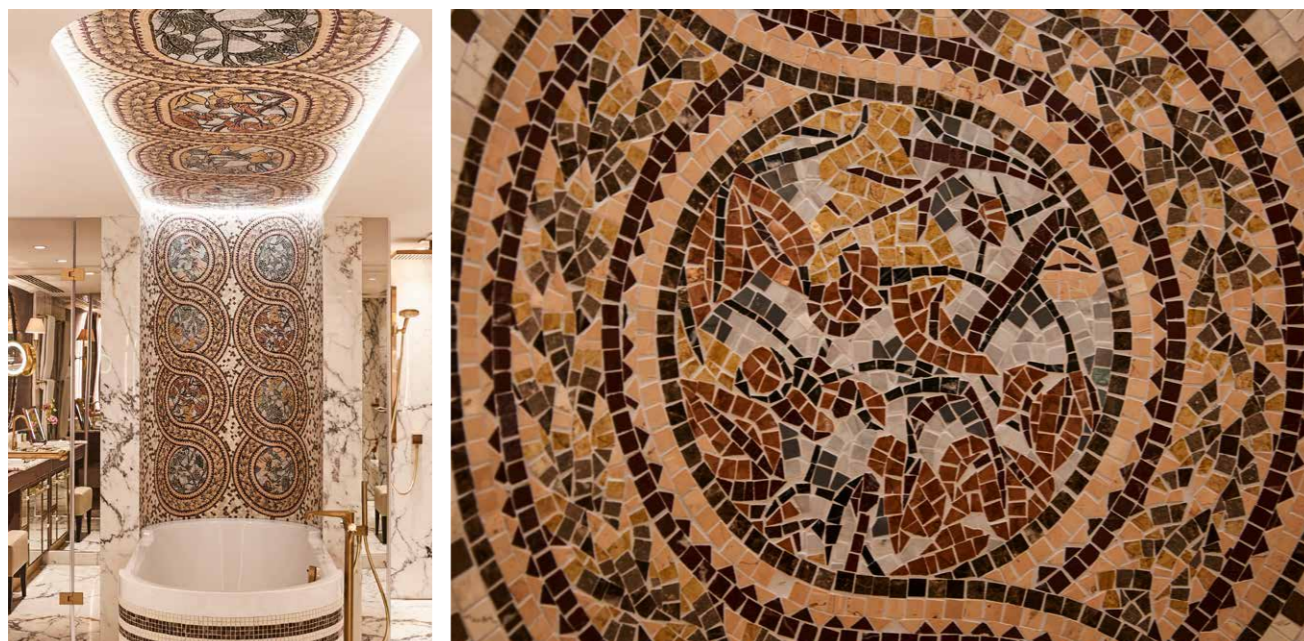


TAPESTRY MASTERPIECE

A tapestry, woven from the finest white leather, hangs above the headrest in the master bedroom.

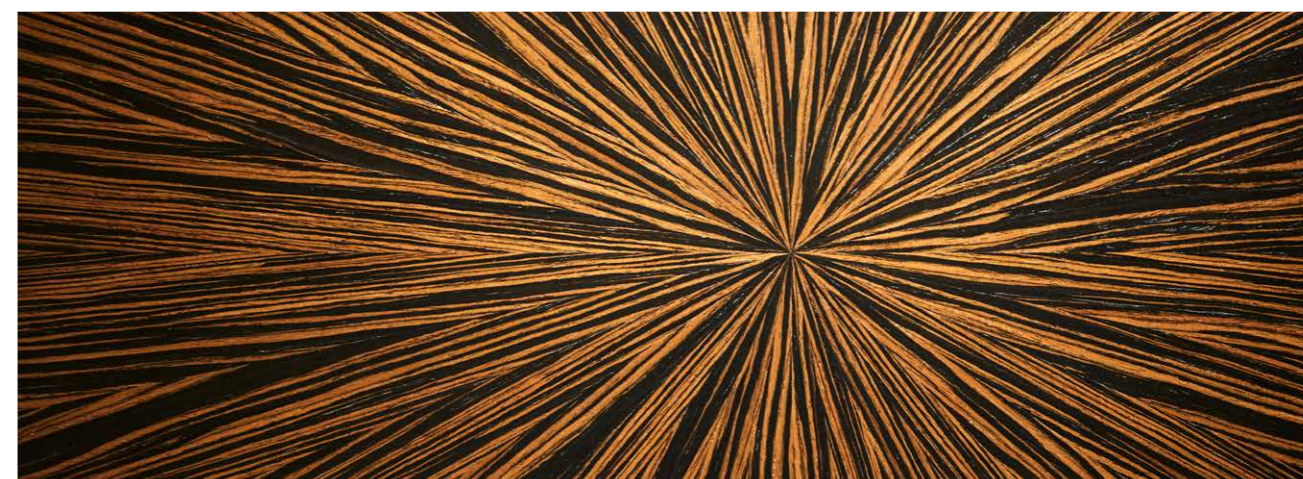
FOUR SEASONS WORK OF ART

In an arresting surprise, the designer presents the suite's key visual in the luxurious bathroom. Laurel wreaths enclose the blossoms representing each of the four seasons in a mosaic style favoured during the Roman Empire.



ANTIQUÉ FIREPLACES

Part of the Maximilian Suite, as well as the adjoining Deluxe Junior Suite, include three antique fireplaces made from Carrara marble. These fireplaces originated in France during the 19th century.



HANDCRAFTED DOORS

Every door in the Royal Wing is made by hand. Veneer leaves no wider than 3cm were inserted individually to achieve the unique radial form. Each door required up to 76 hours for completion.

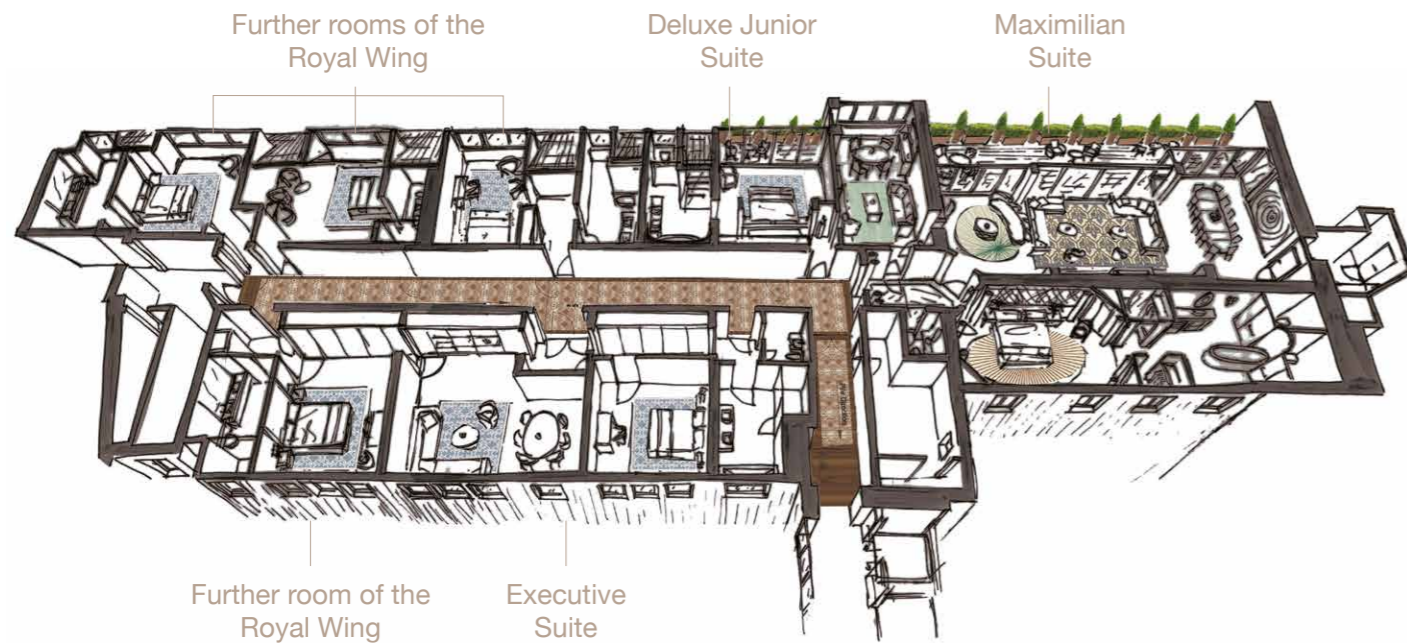
LUXURY SAFE

The luxury safe, by the Munich-based manufacturer Stockinger, is a small jewel box in itself. The safe, which has been integrated within a specially-commissioned mirrored cupboard, is made with three watch winders and valued at EUR 22,000.

STATUES

Two chest-high water buffalo statues made from stone are just another intriguing detail of this exclusive suite.

560 SQ M OF PRIVACY

During the year of its 160th anniversary, the Vier Jahreszeiten created a royal wing, which secures the grand hotel's leading position in the luxury market for years to come.

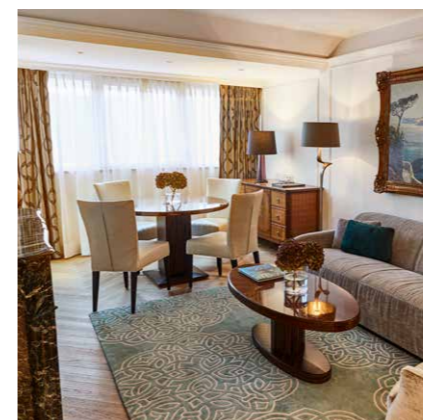
Situated on the top floor of the hotel, the Royal Wing can be subdivided into seven discreet units, and when booked exclusively, comprises 560 sq m of grandeur.

- Seven bedrooms
