Constructed by King Maximilian II of Bavaria - the father of King Ludwig II between 1833 - 1837





History of Hohenschwangau castle

Hohenschwangau Castle was mentioned the first time in records of the 12th century. Until the 16th century its owners were the knights of Schwangau. During the following time it changed hands a couple of times and was partially destroyed during different wars.

1833 – 1837: Crown prince Maximilian of Bavaria rebuilt the ruin of Schwanstein Castle in neogothic style just for a holiday house. This is where King Ludwig II has spent most of his life and later his holidays together with his mother Queen Mary and his brother prince Otto. From here he planned to build his dream castle Neuschwanstein and observed the constructions. After his death, his mother spent her holidays alone here. Prince regent Luitpold and members of the royal family of Bavaria spent their holidays there until in 1970th.

The visitor can see all rooms in Hohenschwangau Castle, the complete apartment of King Maximilian II which later was the apartment of his son Ludwig II. And you can see the complete apartment of King Ludwig's mother — Queen Mary. Feel the warm atmosphere with the marvelous view to Neuschwanstein Castle, to the lake Alpsee and to the Bavarian and Tirolean alps.
