Munich's museum district boasts a unique concentration of high-calibre museums and art galleries. And as if that weren't enough, Kunstareal is embedded in the vibrant Maxvorstadt district. Its universities, boutiques, spacious green spaces and historic cafés will tempt you to stroll round, stop off and enjoy life. However, the main attaction is still the art itself. With 18 museums and exhibition halls, 42 art galleries and many other cultural institutions, Kunstareal is one of Europe's most important cultural locations – and all this in less than a district of a square mile! What better place to be inspired by art than here?





#### Schlachthofviertel Unembellished and hip

As a result, this district has retained its rolled-up-sleeves charm to this day. But at the same time, upheaval is everywhere to be seen. With large sites repeatedly becoming vacant in recent years, this district is changing fast and attracting creative and young people in particular. The outcome is the city's the most colourful cultural landscape!



#### Neuhausen-Nymphenburg The green district in the west

Nymphenburg Palace and its park are among Munich's top sights. But the charisma of the Bavarian royals' summer residence actually extends far beyond the palace walls. The entire neighbourhood is a fairy-tale residential area with impressive villas and old buildings from the Wilhelminian period, small shops and lively cafés. Half the properties in Neuhausen are listed buildings or ensembles. Besides enjoying this relaxed atmosphere, there's lots of other things to discover as well – the green paradise of the Botanical Garden, various museums and the largest beer garden in Bavaria. Welcome to a neighbourhood full of light and air!

# Other districts From chic to multiculti

#### Schwabing Living nostalgia

The heyday of Schwabing's bohemian scene began around 1900 with artists and literary figures settling around the University and the Art Academy. They shaped the spirit of Schwabing. To this day, you can still say that "Schwabing is not a place, but a state of mind," as the writer Franziska zu Reventlow put it a century ago.







#### Bahnhofsviertel Colourful and lively

Munich's Bahnhofsviertel stands for multiculti coexistence, interesting eating places, young artists and art galleries. So it's quite different from the rest of the city. Take a round-the-world trip around the main station.

## Giesing

#### A working-class district in transition

Giesing is a truly authentic neighbourhood where they avoid new-fangled things, go to the Boazn (the Munich-style pub) in the evening and flock to the stadium on Saturdays – but for 1860, not Bayern Munich. Yet this district is incredibly lively and diverse – with exciting breweries and bistros, alternative cultural projects and open-air concerts.





"Munichen" was first mentioned in a document in 1158.



#### Haidhausen A village in the city

Pariser Platz, Orleansplatz, Sedanstraße, Bordeaux-Platz: you might even think you're in France when you're strolling through Haidhausen. Interestingly enough, the locals also refer to this part of the city with its captivating mix of glamorous cosmopolitan flair and village character as the "French District". Here, they know how to appreciate quality without being boastful – and thus maybe comes closest to the Munich lifestyle, with its coziness and diversity.
